### Helpful information to prepare for major disasters

The information below is a summary of more detailed information that can be found in the RED FOLDER that is given to new Villages residents by the Emergency Preparedness Committee (EPC). If a folder is lost, or more than five years out of date, a new copy may be obtained at the Public Safety Administration office in Building C.

### Make plans for what you will do in an emergency

Plan in advance for what you will do in an emergency, such as a fire or earthquake. Be prepared to assess the situation. Use common sense and whatever you have on hand to take care of yourself and your loved ones.

#### 1. Get a kit of emergency supplies

Be prepared to improvise and use what you have on hand to make it on your own for at least three days, maybe longer. While there are many things that might make you more comfortable, think first about fresh water, food and clean air.

#### **Recommended supplies for a basic survival kit:**

- Water—one gallon per person per day, for drinking and sanitation
- Non-perishable food at least a three-day supply
- Battery-powered or hand crank radio and NOAA
- Weather Radio with tone alert and extra batteries for both
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- First Aid kit
- Whistle to signal for help
- Filter mask or cotton tee-shirt, to help filter air
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- Manual can opener if kit contains canned food
- Plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- Important family documents
- Items for unique family needs, such as daily prescription medications, medical equipment, etc.

**Consider two kits.** In one, put everything you will need to stay where you are and make it on your own. The other should be a lightweight, smaller version you can take with you if you have to get away.

#### 2. Develop a Family Emergency Plan

Your family may not be together when disaster strikes, so plan how you will contact one another and review what you will do in different situations. **Consider a plan where each family member calls, or e-mails, the same friend or relative in the event of an**  emergency. It may be easier to make a longdistance phone call than to call across town, so an out-of-town contact may be in a better position to communicate among separated family members. Be sure each person knows the phone number and has the means to call the emergency contact. You may have trouble getting through, or the phone system may be down altogether, but be patient. Depending on your circumstances and the nature of the disaster, the first important decision is whether you stay put or get away. You should understand and plan for both possibilities. Use common sense and the information you are learning here to determine if there is immediate danger. Watch television and listen to the radio for official instructions as they become available.

### Be Ready

### Preparing makes sense. Get ready now.

Create a plan to shelter-in-place. There are circumstances when staying put and creating a barrier between yourself and potentially contaminated air outside, a process known as sheltering-in-place and sealing the room can be a matter of survival. If you see large amounts of debris in the air, or if local authorities say the air is badly contaminated, you may want to shelter-in-place and seal the room. Consider precutting plastic sheeting to seal windows, doors and air vents. Each piece should be several inches larger than the space you want to cover so that you can duct tape it flat against the wall. Label each piece with the location of where it fits. Use all available information to assess the situation. Quickly bring your family and pets inside, lock doors, and close windows, air vents and replace dampers. Immediately turn off air conditioning, forced-air heating systems, exhaust fans and clothes dryers. Take your emergency supplies and go into the room you have designated. Seal all windows, doors and vents. Understand that sealing the room is a temporary measure to create a barrier between you and contaminated air. Monitor instructions from local emergency management officials on your phone, computer, television or radio.

**Create a plan to get away.** Plan in advance how you will assemble your family and anticipate where you will go. *Choose several destinations in different directions* so you have options in an emergency. If you have a car, keep at least a half tank of gas in it at all times. Become familiar with alternate routes as well as other means of transportation out of your

area. If you do not have a car, plan how you will leave if you have to. Take your emergency supply kit, unless you have reason to believe it is contaminated and lock the door behind you. Take pets with you if you are told to evacuate; however, if you are going to a public shelter, keep in mind they may not be allowed inside. If you believe the air may be contaminated, drive with your windows and vents closed and keep the air conditioning and heater turned off. Listen to the radio for instructions. Know Emergency Plans at school and work. Talk to your employer about emergency plans. Find out how they will communicate with families during an emergency. If you are an employer, be sure you have an emergency preparedness plan. Review and practice it with your employees. A community working together during an emergency also makes sense. Talk to the EPC and your neighbors about how you can work together.

### **3. Be informed about what might happen**

Some of the things you can do to prepare for the unexpected, such as assembling a supply kit and developing a family emergency plan, are the same for both a natural or man-made emergency. However, there are significant differences among potential terrorist threats, such as biological, chemical, explosive, nuclear and radiological, which will impact your decisions and actions you take. By beginning a process of learning about these specific threats, you are *preparing yourself* to react in an emergency. Go to ready.gov to learn more about potential threats and other emergencies or call 1-800-BE-READY (1-800-237-3239) for a free brochure. Be prepared to adapt this information to your personal circumstances and make every effort to follow instructions received from authorities on the scene. Also learn about the EPC's local emergency plan. With these simple preparations, you can be ready for the unexpected.

### 4. Get involved in preparing your community

After preparing yourself and your family for possible emergencies, take the next step and get involved in preparing your community.
